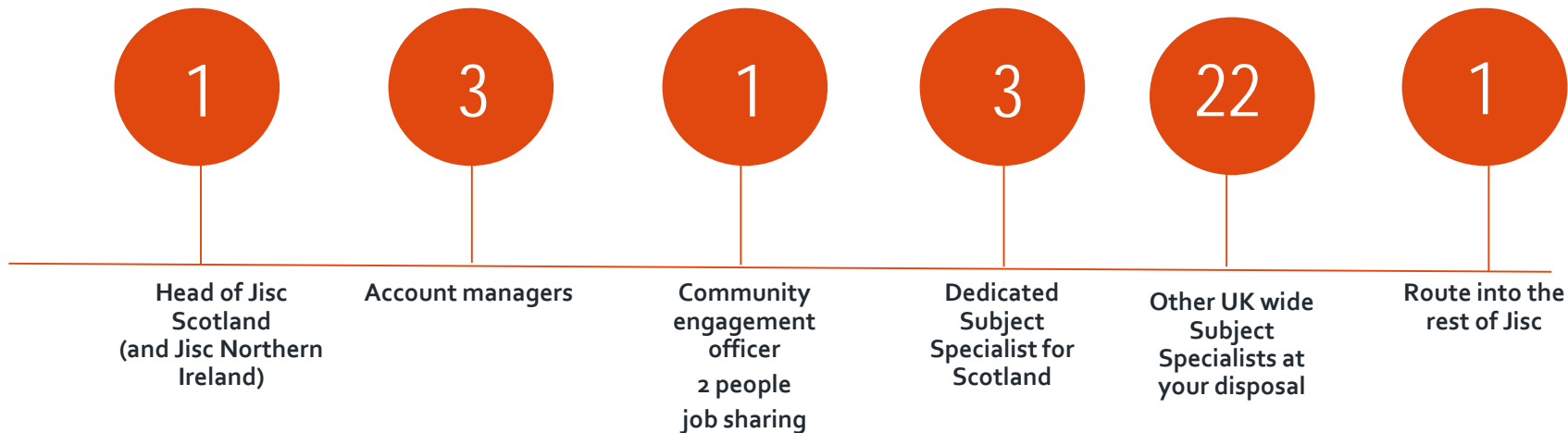

- » **Mainstreaming inclusive practice** (advice for library, academic, student services, basic skills staff, IT/network, learning technologists)

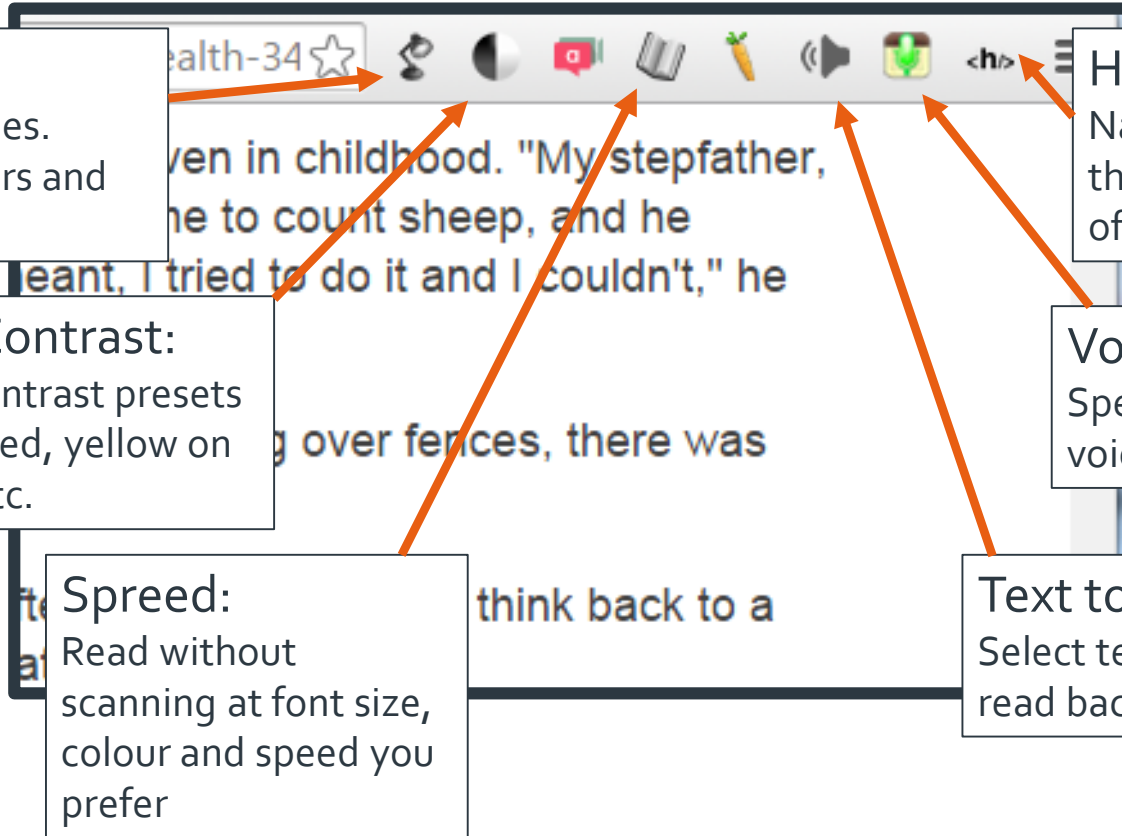

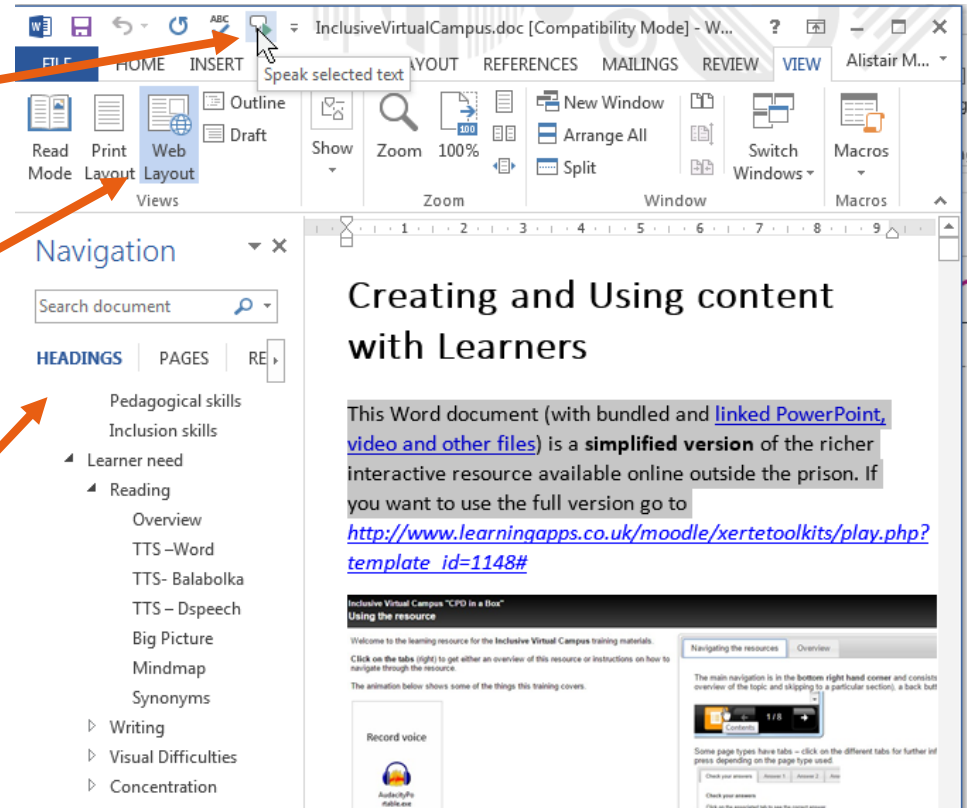
